## Will, NC, Mecklenburg, Jones Bradley 1778

In the name of God, Amen.

I, JONES BRADLEY of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, carpenter, being healthy & of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian funeral at the direction of my executors, nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has please God to bless me in this life, I give, demise & dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

I give and bequeath to **WINEFRET BRADLEY**, my dearly beloved daughter, all my movable estate.

Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight.
