August 4th 1788

In the name of God Amen.

I **JOHN BRYANT** of Northampton County in North Carolina being in my perfect senses to make this my last will and testament as to my soul and body I leave them in the hands of God who gave it me. My worldly goods I dispose of as follows, to wit:

FIRST and foremost I desire my stock to be sold and my just debts discharged.

THEN I give and bequeath to my son **JOHN BRYANT** my Manor Plantation & one negro boy FREAD to him and his heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath to my daughter **WINNIE BRYANT** my negro girl AGG, also one feather bed.

I give and bequeath to my daughter **POLLY BRYANT** my negro wench LID and one feather bed.

As to my above mentioned estate, personal, after it be sold and my just debts discharged, whatever may remain my desire is it may be equally divided between my three above mentioned children.

I hereby appoint my beloved friends **JONAS BRYANT** and **ABSALOM COBB** executors of this my last will and testament.
