Parit the Indian Shashamar her doe Acknowledge in Open Court that that he have sold unto Henry Bowman the Indian Right of the seven Hundred Acres of Land that was lately in difference Between the said Henry Bowman and Alexander Draper Lying Between the Land of the said Alexander Draper and the Land that the said Henry Bowman bought of John Depree for which he Acknowledged to have received full satisfaction for the same.

Cornelius Johnson petition that the Four Hundred Acres of Land surveyed lately for the said Cornelius Johnson Called white Oak neck may be returned in the Certificate of survey in the name of Richard Jatte he having given him A Consideration for the same, which the Court grant and this Order of Court shall be a sufficient warrant for the Surveyors so doing

The Court grant unto John Roads the piece of waste Land that Joynes to the new forest being about One Hundred and Twenty Acres & to be surveyed into the same warrant given Out 10<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> 82

The Court grant unto Joseph Thorne Three Hundred Acres of Land warrant given Out 21<sup>st</sup> Instant

Halmaria Millbank Acknowledge in Open Court a Patton and conveyance of a certain parcel of land called by the name of with Bay lying on the north side of the great Creek, containing Eight Hundred acres of Land, unto John Kirk his heirs and Assignes forever, and do promise and Engage to give the said John Kirk his Assignes quiet and peaceable possession of the said Land and premises by last day of October now next ensuing the date here of.
