

I know all men by these presents that I George Blackston of Kent County and State of Delaware do think it wrong and oppressive to hold Negroes in Abjgit Slavery and contrary to the Law of God and elemece Revelation do hereby Manumit and Set free to all intent and purposes from the estate hereof Jacob Blackston, Catharine Blackston, Rebecca Blackston Michael Blackston and also my Negro man Benjamin Blackston when he Shall be Niniod & Marcell to whom I have hured him to three years Nine months and fifteen days and also Jack Blackston at the expiracion of nine years from the twenty Eighth day of March last he being then twelve years old and further I do hereby against me my heirs Executors and administrators and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever claiming or hereafter to claim by through or under me my heirs executors and administrators or either of them their heirs executors or administrators warrant and by these presents forever the freedom of all and singular the aforesaid described Negroes defend. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the fifteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two

This Indenture made the ninth day of June anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and two between Elizabeth Shepherd and Richie Shepherd (Daughters and only heirs of Thomas Shepherd deceased) of Kent County and State of Delaware of the one part and Walter Douglas of the same County and State of the other party witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Shepherd & Richie Shepherd for and in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred & twenty six Pounds ten Shillings current lawful money of the State of Delaware to them in hand paid by the said Walter Douglas the receipt whereof the said Elizabeth Shepherd & Richie Shepherd doth hereby acknowledge themselves therewith fully satisfied contented and paid and do by these presents give, Grant, Bargain, Sell, alienate, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Walter Douglas his heirs Executors, Administrators, & assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of Land, Grist Mill, Fulling Mill & Plantation situate lying and being in the said hundred & County and State aforesaid - Beginning at a Maple on the edge of Browns Branch at the mouth of a Run and running from thence South Sixty degrees East one hundred and thirteen perches to a persimmon on a branch thence down the several courses of a branch till it intersects Browns Branch aforesaid, thence up the several courses of the main stream of Browns Branch to the place of Beginning containing and laid out for one hundred and thirty five & three quarters acres of Land more or less, together with the Mills & Condemned lands thereunto belonging which is aforesaid viz Beginning at a corner marked Red Oak standing on the North side

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Browns Branch and running up the said Branch North West sixteen perches, thence North fifty degrees West twenty eight and an half perches to a corner marked Red Oak Sapling, thence with thirty degrees East thirty perches to a corner marked Red Oak Standing by the said branch and along the said Branch bineting therewith Seventy four perches to a corner marked White Oak standing by the side of said Branch, thence South ten degrees West ten perches to the place beginning, containing and land out for two acres of land condemned for the use of Red Printleys Mill Anno Domini 1746 February the 6th Together with all the houses, houses, Barns, Stables orchards, meadows, fences, buildings, Woods & under Woods, timber trees, Water & waterways, Swamps, Savannas, Easements, Profits, Conveniences, Adventures, Hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in any manner or way pertaining, all Rents, Issues & Profits, likewise all Deeds Writings, Conveyances, Instruments, proprietees, Claims & Demands in law or equity— together with all lands, Woods, fields & adjoining Lands the aforesaid lands which is or was the right of Thomas Shepherd deceased & which is or was intended to be conveyed to him, In all and singular the aforesaid hereby Granted lands & premises with the mills & Apparatus therunto belonging & of in & to all & every part & parcel thereof, To have and to hold the said lands & premises and unto the said Walter Douglas his heirs, Executors, Administrators assigns to the only Proper use of him the said Walter Douglas his heirs and assigns, ever, under the yearly Rent now Due or hereafter to become due to the Chief or Servts of the Fee thereof and the said Elizabeth Shepherd & Ruthie Shepherd his heirs, Executors and Administrators & for each and every of them the within described lands & premises hereby Granted and every part and parcel thereof, against themselves against their heirs and against each and every of them and against any person claiming under Thomas Shepherd deceased and against George Horsford the tinker aforesaid his heirs claiming under him & from the said Elizabeth Shepherd and Ruthie Shepherd & claiming under them and all and every other person or persons whatsoever lawfully having or hereafter to claim by from or under them or any of them The said Elizabeth Shepherd & Ruthie Shepherd & their heirs Executors, & Administrators Shall and will bear and forever Defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Elizabeth Shepherd & Ruthie Shepherd hath set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year first written
