This Indenture made the thirteenth day of November in the year of our Lord
One Thousand Eight Hundred Between William McKitt of Mispillion Hundred
in the County of Kent and State of Delaware, yeoman, and Rebecca his wife of the one
part, And William Sharp of the same hundred, County and State aforesaid Yeoman,
of the other part. Whereas James McKitt late of the County and State aforesd was seized
and possessed of certain real Property Situate in the County of Kent aforesaid, and being so
thereof seized departed this life intestate, in which case his Real property or Land and Estate
fell to his several Issues ^{said} namely, James, Elizabeth, John, Robert and William the same
William that is party thereto, and the said Real Estate were on the 27th day of May
A D 1779 divided among the said Issues above named as appears by an order of the
Orphans Court for that purpose with the Return of Division annexed thereto, both of which
Remains among the proceedings of the said Orphans Court at Dover for Kent Co^y aforesaid,
whereby the said William McKitt became the Sole Proprietor of eighty four acres of Land
and Swamp by virtue of the first division which is above described, and the said William
McKnitt afterward sold and conveyed Twenty nine acres and three fourths of an acre from
the Northernmost Side of said Eighty four acres to Benjamin Black, and at the same time
purchased of Robert McKitt above named the Quantity of forty seven acres adjoining said
Eighty four acres on the southeast side, which addition made out One Hundred and
one acre and one Quarter, but the said William McKitt having since sold unto John
McKnitt, all the part which lies on the West side of the Lane Road leading from Marshy
hope to Milford, has reduced the quantity which actually belongs to William McKitt
at present to about Ninety acres the metes and bounds of which said Ninety acres are
as follows Viz Beginning at a marked Spanish Oak on a Ridge being a corner of
Lands belonging to Robert McKitt and Jesse Turner and running from thence along
Turners line North Sixty three degrees West one Hundred and eight perches to the main
Road leading from Marshy hope to Milford, thence along said road dividing this part
from the part sold off to John McKitt South Twelve and an half degrees West forty nine
perches and two linths to a large White Oak on the West side of said Road, thence with
said Road South one degree East thirty four perches to a corner in said Road on a cause-
way thence south forty three degrees West three perches and four tenths to a corner in
Road wherestood a Persimmon bush, now leaving said road and running South forty
Nine degrees East Twenty nine perches to a marked Hickory thence South Thirty seven
degrees East one hundred and twenty four perches to a black Oak, thence North forty
Eight degrees East thirty two perches to a White Oak, thence south seventy nine degrees
East thirty perches, thence North Sixty three degrees and an half East thirty one per-
ches and eight tenths to a gum, and then North Thirty One degrees and twelve Minutes
West one hundred and forty one perches and five tenths to the Beginning containing
about Ninety acres as aforesaid more or less. Now this Indenture witnesseth
that the said William McKitt and Rebecca his wife for and in Consideration of the

sum of two hundred and twenty pounds Lawful Money to them in hand paid
secured to be paid by the said William Sharp the Receipt whereof they do hereby ac-
knowledge Have granted, bargained Sold, Aliened, Remised Released, Enfeoffed, conve-
nanted and confirmed and by these presents do grant, bargain, Sell, Alien, Remise, Release
Convey and confirm unto the said William Sharp his Heirs and Assigns forever,
~~all the~~ above Recited Ninety acres of Land be the same more or less with all the
provements appurtenances and privileges thereunto belonging or in anywise appur-
taining to Have and to Hold the same unto the said William Sharp his Heirs
and Assigns forever. In Witness whereof the said William McKitt and Rebecca
his Wife have hereunto set their Hands and seals the day and year first above wri-
ten.
