This Indenture made the sixth day of February In the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred fifty and eight Between Joseph Sims and the his Wife Adm^{rs} of Henry John Westly late dec^d of the one part and William Westly Esq^r of the other part whereas there is a certain tract or parcel of Land situate in the County of Sussex on Delaware in Rehoboth hundred being part of a tract of Land formerly conveyed to Cornelius Turner by William Bryan and Ann Elizabeth his Wife and afterwards conveyed by the said Cornelius Turner to the said Henry John Westly the Bound and courses are as follow to wit Beginning at a stake in or about the head line of Warrens Patent thence along said line South forty eight degrees East sixteen perches to a corner Red oak of said Warrens thence North forty two degrees East one hundred and eighty perches to a corner small White Oak thence North forty eight degrees West fifty four and a half perches to a corner White Oak thence North forty eight degrees West fifty four and a half perches to a corner White Oak thence North forty one degrees East thirty perches to a corner Bay tree thence North forty eight degrees West two perches to a corner Post thence South forty one degrees West thirty perches to a corner stake thence by a dividing line South twenty nine and a quarter degrees West one hundred and Eighty four perches home to the first bounded stake containing and laid out for forty one acres and a half acres of Land And whereas the said Henry John Westly in his Life time by a Sealed Instrument in Writing bound himself to the above named William Westly to transfer convey and make over in due form of Law the said Land and Premises to the said William Westly according to the Tenor of the said Sealed instrument of writing And whereas by an Act of Assembly of this Government Entituled an Act to improve Ex^{ts} and Adm^{rs} within this Government by leave of Court to convey lands intended for with their Descendants It is enacted where any Person hath any Bonds or other Sealed Instrument to oblige him her or themselves to convey Lands which have not been conveyed in their Life time upon proving the said Bond or other Sealed instrument in Court as by the said Act is directed and Shewing the same the Ex^{ts} or Adm^{rs} are at Liberty to prefer a Petition to the Court Praying leave to convey the said Lands pursuant to the sealed instrument and which Petition the said Court are obliged by this Act to grant it being first proved the purchase money is all paid which several matters and things have pursuant to the said Act of Assembly have been complied with as by the several Records relating thereto manifestly appears Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said Joseph Sims and Abigail his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty two pounds current lawfull money of the Government the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and of every part and parcel thereof do fully and shortly request Remerate and discharge the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns for ever shall granted Bargained and sold and by these presents do grant Bargain and sell unto him the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns the said forty one and a half acres of Land with all and singular the Premises with the Appurtenances thereto beloning under the Ready Quit rents already due and which hereafter shall become due and payable to the Chief Lord or Lords of the fee or fees to have and to hold the said Land and all and singular the Premises with the Appurtenances unto him the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns for ever And the said Joseph Sims and Abigail his Wife Adm^{rs} as afo^r do for themselves their heirs Ex^{ts} and Adm^{rs} Covenant to and with the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns to Warrant and defend the said Land and Premises with all and singular the Appurtenances unto him the said William Westly his heirs and Assigns for ever against them the said Joseph Sims and Abigail his Wife their heirs Ex^{ts} or Adm^{rs} and all and every other person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the said Land and Premises By from or under them the said Joseph Sims and Abigail his Wife Adm^{rs} as afo^r shall and will Warrant and defend by Virtue in witness whereof the said Joseph Sims and Abigail his Wife Adm^{rs} as afo^r By Virtue of their Administration afo^r Act of Assembly afo^r order of Court afo^r and the Special Powers thereby given have hereunto set their hands and affixed their Seals this day and Year first above written
