Cabin Branch and running thence South Thirty seven Degrees East Twenty Perches to a marked
Dogwood Thence South Thirty seven & a half Degrees East sixteen & a half Perches to a cluster of small
marked Hickorys Thence South sixty one & three Quarters East seventeen Perches to a marked White Oak
Thence South Eighty Three Degrees East sixteen Perches to a Black Oak Thence South forty five
and a half East Twenty six Perches to a sassafras stake by a marked White Oak Then South
Sixteen and a half Degrees East Twelve & a half Perches to a large marked Black Oak by the fence

This Indenture made the Twenty Third Day of November one Thousand seven hundred & sixty
Nine Between Robert Warren of Sussex County on Delaware Yeoman of y^e one part & rees Meridith and
John Mifflin of y^e City of Philadelphia Merchants of y^e other Part Whereas there is a certain Tract of
Land in y^e Broadkill Forest of Sussex County on Delaware adjoining Lands formerly taken up
by John Lord Ephraim Darby & Samuel Pellyjohn & Thomas Dodd which said Tract of Land was
granted unto y^e said Robert Warren by Virtue of a Proprietary Warrant Dated at Philadelphia the
Twenty fourth day of May one Thousand seven hundred & forty nine and surveyed in the year one Thousand
seven hundred and fifty six at which time it was called Two strings to a Row Beginning at a Corner
Red Oak being a Corner of John Lord's Land as afo^r From Thence running North twenty seven &
