 and the forty ninth year of the Independence of the United States of America between William
 Briant of the County and State aforesaid of the one part and Lewis Yancy of the
 County of Hall and State aforesaid of the other part Witness that the said William
 Briant for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars to him in hand
 paid by the said Lewis Yancy, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath bargained
 sold released and conveyed unto the said Lewis Yancy his heirs and assigns all that
 tract or parcel of land lying and being in the Fifth district of Hall County
 and said State, which said tract of land is known and designated in the plan
 of said district, by the number forty ninth, together with all and singular the rights
 members and appurtenances thereof whatsoever belonging or appertaining and the remains
 rents issues and profits thereof and every part thereof to have and to hold the said
 tract of land and all and singular the premises and appurtenances thereto belonging
 as aforesaid and every part thereof unto the said Lewis Yancy his heirs and
 assigns against him the said William Briant and his heirs and all and every
 other person or persons whatsoever claiming or to claim the same Shall and
 Well Warrant and for ever defend by these presents in Witness whereof the said
 William Briant hath hereunto set his hand and seal, the day and year above

This indenture made the fourteenth day of May Eighteen hundred and sixteen
 between Joseph Little of the State of Georgia of the one part and Samuel H.
 McCutchen of the aforesaid State and County of Jackson of the other part.
 Witness that, the aforesaid Joseph Little for and in consideration of the sum of one
 hundred Dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
 and confessed hath granted bargained sold and by these presents do fully grant,
 bargain and sell unto him the aforesaid Samuel H. McCutchen all that tract of
 land containing three hundred and nine acres be the same more or
 less being part of a grant to Joseph Little for five hundred acres bearing
 date the eighteenth day of November Eighteen hundred and fifteen Situate
 in Jackson County, State of Georgia beginning on a Walnut on Buffington
 line thence N. 70 E. 18.50 to a post oak, thence N 20 W 9 chs to a P. L. thence
 N 20 E 24.50 pine, thence N 70 E 46 chs post oak, thence S. 40 E 37 chs to a red
 oak on Williams' line thence S 70 W 12.50 to a post oak, thence with
 Williams S. 20 E 22 chs to a Station Red oak thence S 60.10 37 chs to Kings
 pine, thence with King N 70 W 46.50 to Wahoo, thence S. 20 W 11.50 to a Mahoe,
 on the N. O. river, thence up the meanders of said River to the beginning Walnut
 to have and to hold all the above described land & premises with the appurtenances
 to the same belonging or in any manner appertaining unto him the
 aforesaid Samuel H. McCutchen, his heirs and assigns for ever to their own
 benefit and behoof & the aforesaid Joseph Little does warrant & forever
 defend the aforesaid land and premises with the appurtenances to the same
 belonging or in any manner appertaining from himself his heirs and
 assigns unto him the aforesaid Samuel H. McCutchen, his heirs and
 assigns for ever in testimony whereof
