

Georgia This Indenture made this 12 day of September in the year of our Lord eight hundred and thirty three between John Stroud of the State of Georgia of one part & Ebenezer Camp of the same State & County of the other part witnesseth that said Stroud for in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged that he have this day bargained, sold & confirmed unto the said Ebenezer Camp & his heirs by these presents bargain & sell & confirmed one hundred acres of land lying on the waters of Marbury Creek & being part of a Eleven hundred acre survey granted to Baker Joining Salmon on the one side & Hobbs on the other Beginning on the creek on the branch then N 45 E 53. loc pole oak then S 27 W 20 30 loc red oak bunch then N 45 W 38.00 loc poplar on the branch & then up S branch to the beginning corner To have & to hold the said tract of land to the said Ebenezer Camp his heirs & assigns forever & the said Stroud do warrant for ever defend the said land & defend from myself my heirs or administrators or assigns & all other persons claiming or in any way laying any claim or title to the same to Ebenezer Camp his heirs or assigns or administrators As witness my hand & seal this day & date above written

This Indenture made this twentieth day of March eight hundred & thirty three between Alexander Harper of the State of Georgia & County of Jackson of one part & Stephen Brient of State of Georgia & County of Jackson of the other part witnesseth that the aforesaid Alexander Harper for in consideration of the sum of one hundred & eighty dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is confessed & acknowledged & he granted bargained & sold & by these presents do & fully grant bargain & sell unto him the aforesaid Stephen Brient his heirs & assigns forever all that tract of land whereon said Stephen Brient now lives containing nearly one acre or less in the County of Jackson on the South fork of the Walnut fork Beginning at a Saw wood stump then S 53 W 30 1/2 to an oak then N 45 W 33 1/2 to a dogwood & then down the meander of S Creek to the beginning To have & to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances to the same belonging or in any manner appertaining to him the aforesaid Stephen Brient his heirs & assigns forever & the aforesaid Alex^r Harper do by these presents warrant for ever defend the land & premises aforesaid against himself his heirs & assigns & all other persons or persons whatsoever In testimony whereof the said Alex^r Harper hath hereunto set his hand & seal the date above written
