 sold aliened Released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant Bargain sell alien Release & confirm
 unto the said John Hollingsworth and to his heirs and assigns forever, all that Tract of Land containing
 one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less. Bounded South west by Land of Joseph
 Humphrey and East by Joseph Glad and Caleb Howell Land and on all other sides Vacant Land at
 the time of Survey as will more fully appear by Grant for the same to David O'Bryan dated
 the sixteenth day of November one thousand seven hundred & ninety three and in the Eighteenth Year
