

In obedience to an order of the County Court of ~~Mass~~
 and Quarter Sessions issued November Term 1816 we the
 subscribers having been sworn upon the Holy Evangelist
 of Almighty God have Laid off and allotted, to each of
 the Heirs of William Sasser Dec'd. The following Tracts and
 Lots of Land, as also the Lots belonging to the s.d. William
 Sasser in the Town of Smithfield in the following manner
 To wit —



Reg^m for Polly Bryan wife of Benjamin Bryan at a State
 on the Bank of Hence River in the Earl of Granvilles Line runs
 his Line E 208 pole to the Smithfield road then with the Meanders
 of the road Thirty one pole to a stake then West to Hence River then
 up the Meanders of the River to the Reg^m Containing Forty acres
 as represented by the above plan No. 1 — Also one other Tract or
 parcel of Land Bought of Peter Slaughter Reg^m at a Spanish oak
 on the river Bank runs S 20 E 101 pole to a white oak (down) then
 N 70 E 148 pole to a Blackjack the Corner of the half of the 98 acre patent
 then E 52 pole to a Large pine in a meadow then S 36 pole to a stake
 then E 83 pole to a Stake Wilkinsons Corner then his Line N 91 pole
 to the old Line then s.d. Line N 70 E 14 pole to a stake then with Wilkinsons
 Line N 75 W 252 pole to a white oak (down) on the Bank of the river
 then down the Meanders of the river to the Reg^m Containing Two Hun-
 dred and Twenty Five acres being Valued in the whole at Eight
 Hundred and Fifty Dollars which is Thirty Seven Dollars more
 than her distributive share

Also Reg^m for the Heirs of Elizabeth Williams formerly

the wife of Isaac Williams at a Hickory Tolly Bryans Corner on the Bank of Neuse River and runs her Line East to a Stake on the Smithfield road then the Meanders of the road Thirty one pole to a small red oak then West to a Birch on the Bank of the river then up the Meanders of the river to the Begⁿ containing Forty acres as represented by the plan N. 2 - Also the Houses and Lot where Sanders and Company now keeps a store represented in the plan of the Town of Smithfield N. 34 the whole being Valued at Eight Hundred and Fifty Dollars being Thirty seven Dollars more than their distributive share

Also Begⁿ for Elizabeth Sasser at a Birch the Heirs of Elizabeth Williams's Corner on the Bank of Neuse River and runs their Line East to a small red oak on the Smithfield road then the Meanders of the road Twenty Five and a quarter pole to a small Hickory then West to a Birch on the river then up the Meanders of the river to the Begⁿ containing Thirty four acres as represented by the plat N. 3 - Also one other Tract or parcel of Land Lying on the Waters of Black Creek Bought by the s. & M^{rs} Sasser ^{Deed} from Dismukes and wife Containing one Hundred and Fifty acres, also the Store House and Lot formerly occupied by Sam. Smith represented in the plan of the Town of Smithfield N. 35. the whole being Valued at Eight Hundred Dollars being Thirteen Dollars Less than her distributive share

Also Beginning for Lewis Sasser at a Birch on the Bank of Neuse River Elizabeth Sasser Corner and runs her Line East to a small Hickory on the road then the Meanders of the Road Twenty Three pole to a Stake & small Hickory. then West to a Birch on the Bank of the river then up the Meanders of the river to the Begⁿ ~~to the Begⁿ~~ containing Thirty acres as represented by the plat N. 4 - Also one other Tract of Land call'd the Buckleberry or Blurton Land Beginning at a Black Gum the 3rd Corner of the Blurton patent at the end of Buckleberry Tocson runs E 200 pole to a pine then N 200 pole to a pine then W 200 pole to Stake then

to the Begⁿ containing Two Hundred and Fifty acres, also one other Tract or parcel of Land on the waters of Black Creek Begⁿ at a Blackjack or Hickory Sapsiter's Corner runs his Line S40 N140 pole to a Black Gum in the Juniper Branch then S46 pole to a pine then E98 pole to a Black Gum, then S33 pole to a B. jack then E170 pole to a stake. Obed Johnstons Corner then his Line N180 pole to a pine then West to the Begⁿ containing Two Hundred and Fifty six acres, also the Lot call'd the red House as represented in the plan of the Town of Smithfield N^o 13 - the whole being valued at Eight Hundred and Thirty one Dollars being Eighteen Dollars more than his distributive share -

Also Begⁿ for Susanna Stevens wife of Edward Stevens at a Birch on the Bank of Neuse River Lewis Sapsiter's Corner and runs his Line East to a small Hickory on the Smithfield road, then the Meanders of the road to the run of Buffilow then down the Meanders of Buffilow about Eighty pole to a Water oak then West to Neuse River on an ash then up the Meanders of the river to the Begⁿ containing Twenty seven acres as represented by the annexed plat N^o 5 - Also the House and Lot call'd the Yellow House, as represented in the plan of the Town of Smithfield N^o 34 - the whole valued at Eight Hundred and Fifty Dollars being Thirty seven Dollars more than her distributive share -

Also Beginning for John Sapsiter at an ash Susanna Stevens Corner on the Bank of Neuse River runs her Line East to a Water oak on Buffilow then down the Meanders of Buffilow to Neuse River then up the Meanders of the River to the Begⁿ containing Twenty five acres as represented by the plat hereunto annexed N^o 6 - Also one other Tract or parcel of Land Opposite Smithfield Begⁿ at a post oak the Last Corner of the 300 acre Dred runs the Giving Line N50 E72 pole to a

Pine Stump by the East path Watsons Corner. then his Line 6227
pole to a B. Jack and post oak in Henry Gays Line (formerly
Glasgows) then his Line S176 pole to a Gum in Bryans Line
then his Line W236 pole to a pine. then N48 pole to a
Black Gum in a Branch then to the Beg^m containing Two
Hundred and Eighty Three acres, also Two Lots in the Town
of Smithfield as represented in the plan of S.D. Town
N. 91 and N. 89, the whole being valued at Six Hundred
and Ninety Eight Dollars, being one Hundred and
Fifteen Dollars Less than his distributive share
