

This Indenture made the 17th day of July 1793 between Robert Campbell of the County of Shelby State of Kentucky of the one part & Thomas Cannon of the County of Shelby State of the other part Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of forty pounds lawful money of the State in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Robert Campbell doth by these presents give grant bargain sell alien & convey unto the said Thomas Cannon his heirs & assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land situate in the County of Shelby State of the said State off on both sides the South branch of Crooked Creek including Jacob Pauls improvement Beginning at a corner on the N. E. corner of the said Pauls & runs N 60 W 12 1/2 po to a corner then S 30 W 12 1/2 po then S 60 E 12 1/2 po to a B. Line then to the Ky line containing 100 acres more or less subject to the usual water course bridges & privileges & also to the usual & ancient pastures meadows profits & herbage thereon & thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining & the version & revision now & then & also all up & by right & by law & demand whatsoever belonging or in anywise appertaining & all mortgages & debts & litters & litters hereunto due & clear to him the said Thomas Cannon his heirs & assigns for ever to the only proper use & behoof of him the said Thomas Cannon his heirs & assigns for ever to have & to hold the said tract of 100 acres of land with the appurtenances to him the said Thomas Cannon his heirs & assigns forever & the said Robert Campbell doth for himself his heirs doth hereby promise & covenant that they shall & will at all times warrant & defend the said land & premises to him the said Thomas Cannon his heirs & assigns forever & he the said Robert Campbell his heirs & assigns shall & will at any time give whatever other writing or writings deed or deeds conveyance or conveyances as may more fully incure & warrant the same In witness whereof the said Robert Campbell hath hereunto set his hand & seal the day & year first above written

This Indenture made the 17th day of July 1793 & 18 years of America Independence between Andrew Alexander of the County of Shelby State of Kentucky of the one part & Hugh Neely of the County of Shelby State of the other part Witnesseth that the said Andrew Alexander for & in consideration of the sum of thirty two pounds ten shillings current money of the State the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged the said Hugh Neely doth by these presents give grant bargain sell alien & convey unto the said Andrew Alexander his heirs & assigns forever a tract of land situate in the County of Shelby State on the South West side of Shallowford Creek Beginning at a P.C. the beginning corner of the upper tract & being the Neelys corner running with the left line of the said tract N 10 E 32 po to a B.D. the other corner of the tract then with the other line of the same W 6 po to a Beechey a nother corner of the tract then with the dividing line N 12 W 40 po to a stone then West 2 1/2 po to a small L.O. in place on the West side of the Way on road then N 45 W 50 po to a stone in the open line of the tract then with the line N 40 E 10 po to the Beginning 32 1/2 po being a line in a line being part of 216 acres originally granted to the said Alexander by Letters Patent bearing date 16 Jan'y 1767 then conveyed by the said Alexander to Charles Alexander in the year 1779 & being 4 po then sold at public sale by George Graham Esq: late Sheriff of the County to John Osborne in the year 1792 July 27 - then conveyed by the said Osborne to the said Andrew Alexander to have & to hold the said 32 1/2 acres of land hereunto granted & a certain tract of land in the said County of Shelby his heirs & assigns forever with all the right & privilege & appurtenances thereunto in anywise appertaining & the same in a right & balance of a line in a line to the only proper use & behoof of the said Hugh Neely his heirs & assigns forever & he the said Andrew Alexander doth hereby covenant & agree that he his heirs & assigns shall & will warrant & forever defend the said land to the said Hugh Neely his heirs & assigns forever against all lawfull claims & demands of all & every person whatever In witness whereof the said Andrew Alexander hath hereunto set his hand & seal the day & year above written
