Knox line North 133 poles to a Black Oak near John Pices line. Then with the P. Pices line to her and the P. Widows Tenants old dividing corner then with the P. Widows Tenants 340 poles to a Stake P. Tenants old corner on the River bank thence down the Meanders of P. River to the beginning. Containing 200 acres be it more or less being a tract of land held by Patent, granted to P. Sam. Calver for 400 acres as appears of record &c. Which said piece or parcel of land, with all ways roads routes and every other appurtenance thereunto belonging or appertaining, the P. John Whiteside for himself his heirs Exec^{rs} & Admin^{rs} doth hereby sold, set over conveyed, released & turned in open market to the P. George Tilghman his heirs Exec^{rs} Admin^{rs} & assigns & the P. John Whiteside for himself his heirs Exec^{rs} & Admin^{rs} doth hereby promise & covenant to & with the P. George Tilghman his heirs Exec^{rs} & assigns that he the P. John Whiteside his heirs Exec^{rs} & Admin^{rs} shall & will warrant & for ever defend the P. piece or parcel of land with all & every of its members & appurtenances free from all lawfull claim of any person or persons whatsoever unto the P. Campbell for himself and his heirs doth hereby bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Thomas Fanner a certain piece or parcel of land lying in P. County of Mecklenburg in North Carolina on the South fork of Crooked-Creek adjoining the land on which the P. Thomas Fanner now lives. Beginning at a pine on the N. side P. Creek running S. 82nd 100 poles to a W. O. Xing P. Creek then N 62nd 260 poles to a Stake then N 12nd 165 poles to a Stake. thence to the beginning. Containing 200 acres or thereabouts. Which piece or parcel of land with all its appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining the P. George W. Campbell for himself his heirs, Exors and Admin^{rs} doth hereby bargained sold set over conveyed & confirmed in open Market unto the P. Thomas Fanner his heirs Exec^{rs} Admin^{rs} and assigns. And the P. George W. Campbell for himself & assigns doth hereby covenant & promise to & with the P. Thomas Fanner his heirs Exec^{rs} Admin^{rs} that he the P. George W. Campbell his heirs Executors & Admin^{rs} will warrant & defend the P. bargained premises with all its appurtenances unto the P. Thomas Fanner his heirs and assigns from the lawfull claim of all men & manner of persons whatsoever. In witness whereof the P. George W.
