Know ye that we for and in consideration of the sum of ten pounds for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into our Treasury by John Bryson have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said John Bryson a tract of Land containing fifty Acres lying and being in our County of Surry on Lovings Creek the middle fork adjoining the said Bryson's former Survey beginning on a post Oak tree running then West crop the said Creek sixteen Chains to a post in Bryson's old line then South in said line eighteen Chains and fifty Links to his corner on a post then West in Bryson's line six Chains to a post Oak tree then South nine Chains and fifty links to a post Oak tree thence East twenty two Chains crop the Creek to a post thence to the Beginning as by the plat hereunto annexed doth appear; together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Land belonging or appertaining: To hold to the said John Bryson his heirs and assigns for ever. Yielding and paying to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise as our General Assembly from time to time may direct. Provided always that the said John Bryson shall cause this Grant to be registered in the Register's Office of our said County of Surry within twelve months from the date hereof otherwise the same shall be void and of no effect.
