to me in hand paid by Thomas Wilson of the same place have granted bargained sold and released unto the said
Thomas Wilson one piece or parcel of land lying and being in Pendleton District on the waters of Saluda
River containing ninety seven acres 35 poles being ~~a tract~~ a tract of land originally granted to Ann
Bryant wife of the above Aaron Bryant dated the fourth day of April anno domini 1791 Beginning at
a pine corner x 3 running S 20 E 1/2 3 chains to a black oak x 3 thence S 15 W 10 chains to a black oak x 3 thence
S 63 W 8 Chs 25 links to a stake x 3 thence N 27 W 45 chains to a black oak x 3 thence N 60 E 32 Chs 30 links
to the beginning corner also an other piece or parcel of land supposed to contain fifty acres of land being part of
a tract of land granted to Robert Wilson containing two hundred acres dated the eighteenth of November
anno domini 1784 Beginning at a road laid out from Wilsons ferry on Saluda to Cambridge
running west with a line of Owen Evans to a stake x 3 thence S to a black oak x 3 thence East to the
road above mentioned thence along said road to the beginning as a line agreed on by said A. Bryant
and John Wilson Junr. Together with all and singular the rights, manors, hereditaments
and appurtenances to the above mentioned premises belonging unto the said Thomas Wilson
