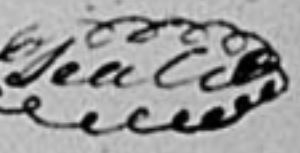

the said James Wood one lot situated in the District of Pendleton con-
taining One acre and N^o 25 bounded on the west by the Public square
on the South by a lot owned by Thomas Hunter and on the East by a lot owned
by William Shackelford Together with all and singular the rights mem-
bers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or
in any wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all and singu-
lar the premises before mentioned unto the said James Wood his heirs
and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and
Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the
said premises unto the said James Wood against myself my heirs and
assigns and against every person whosoever lawfully claiming or to
claim the same or any part thereof In Witness whereof I have hereunto
Set my hand and Seal this fifteenth Day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand Eight hundred and three and in the twenty seventh year
of the Sovereignty and Independance of the United States of North America

ation of the sum of One hundred Dollars to me paid by Samuel Henry
of the County and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and Released

and by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Samuel Henry One hundred and ten Acres more or less Beginning at stake on Benjamin Brumers old line thence running west Course to a post oak corner thence running South West to a Maple corner that line bounding on Andrew Tates land thence running NE to a black oak corner bounding on Fikes land thence running along Benjamin Brumers old line to the Beginning corner first mentioned said land originally granted to Jacob Reid by his Excellency Charles Pinckney at Columbia the third day of October 1791 conveyed to James Miller and from him to the aforesaid Benjamin Brumer together with all and singular the Rights Members Hereditaments appurtenances to the said Samuel Henry ~~his heirs and assigns~~ ^{and assigns} Incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Henry his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind my self my heirs Executors administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Samuel Henry his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs claiming the same or any part thereof ~~Witness my hand and seal~~ this twenty seventh day of January One thousand Eight hundred and two and in the twenty seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence of

Know all Men by these presents that I Benjamin Brumer of Penitentiary District and in the State aforesaid have in Consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars to me paid by Samuel Henry of the State and District aforesaid have granted Bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant Bargain Sell and Release unto the said Samuel Henry all that parcel of land herein described viz. thirty nine acres it being a part of the tract of land on which said Benjamin Brumer now lives beginning at a Black oak sapling corner and running
