said John Davis all that plantation or parcel of land it being part of a tract of land granted to Benjamin
Brimer bearing date 1788 having such shape and form as is represented in the original plat beginning
at a black oak corner and running thence on the original line E. 30 to a W. oak corner and from thence
on S. original Cr. 19, to a L. W. stake corner and from thence on the original line of S. plat to a
branch known by the name of Watsons spring branch and from thence down said branch to the fork
and thence down to a second fork and from thence to the beginning corner. Together with all and sin-
gular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any
wise incident or appertaining To Have and to Hold all and singular the premises before mention-
ed unto the said John Davis his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors
and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John
Davis his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully
