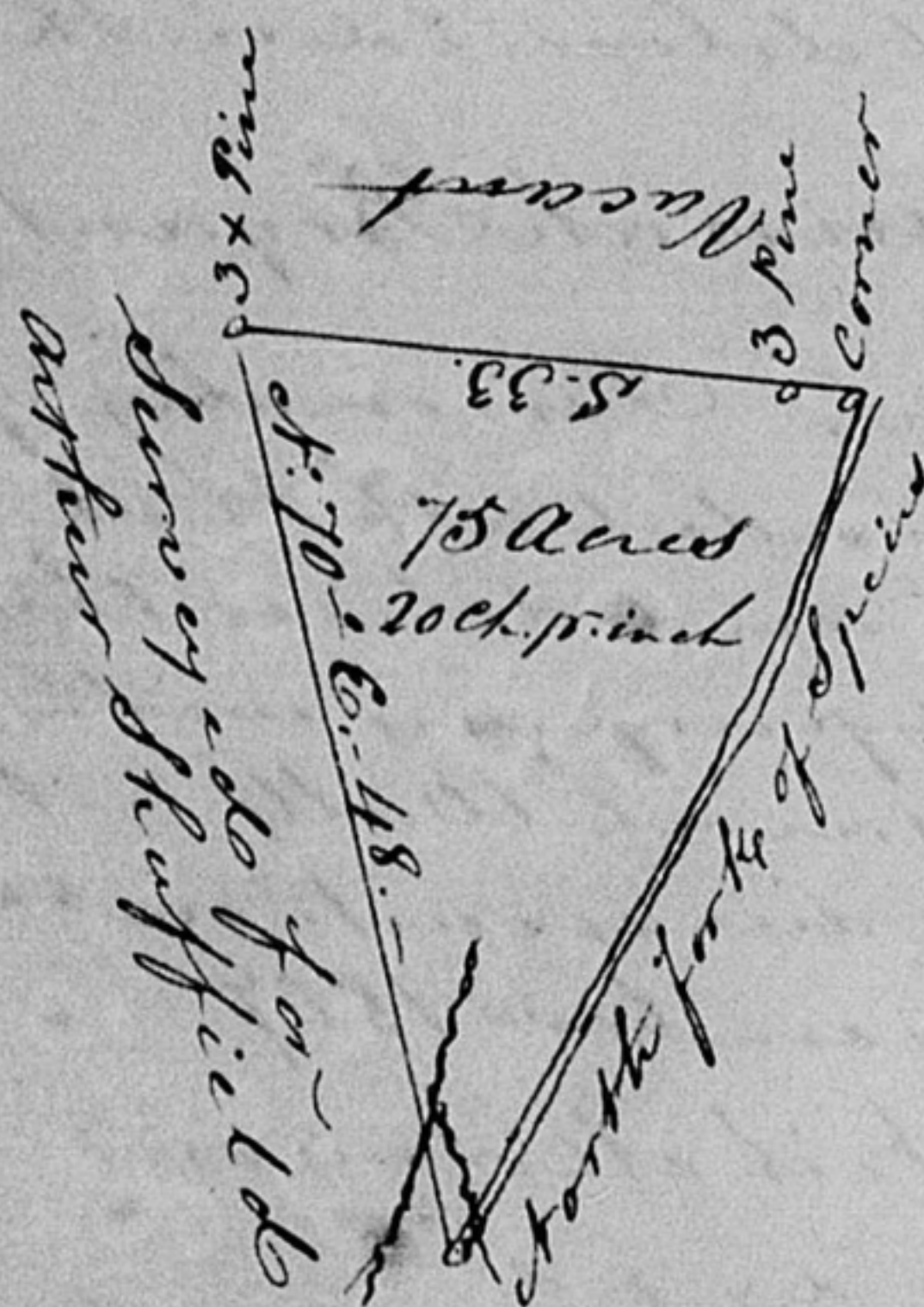


1809 Hogan his heirs and assigns All that tract of land

tract granted to the said Arthur Shuffield the second
day of March 1801, by his Excellency the Governor John
Drayton Esquire, bounded by lines as will appear by the
annexed plat. Together with all ways woods waters
and water courses, houses and out houses orchards heres
ditaments or any thing appertaining unto the said
granted premises. To have and to hold unto him the
said Samuel Hogan his heirs executors administrators
and assigns forever. And I Arthur Shuffield do bind
myself my heirs executors administrators and assigns
forever to warrant and forever defend the said granted
premises from myself and my heirs them and their
heirs forever only. In witness whereunto I set my hands
and affix my seal, this day and year first above written.

land on which the said Lewis Franklin Bryant re-

sided at the time of his death, and which by his
last will and testament he devised to me during my life
time and after my death to my son Edmondo Bryant, in-
cluding the house and orchard thereon standing;
and also all the right and title which I am entitled to
or on the death of any or all of the devisees of the said Le-
wis Franklin Bryant, may have to any lands of which
he died seized, as widow of the said Lewis Franklin
Bryant; together with all the rights, members and ap-
purtenances, thereunto belonging or in any manner
incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and
singular the premises above described unto the said Ken-
neth Morrison his heirs and assigns forever. And I
thereby bind myself my heirs, executors, and administra-
tors, to warrant and forever defend unto the said
Kenneth Morrison his heirs and assigns the above
described tract of one hundred acres of land, against
myself and my heirs and against all other persons whom-
soever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any
part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this twenty fourth
day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and seven, and in the thirty first year
of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States

14 Dec. 1807 The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I John Cherry of ^{in the State} Kershaw district for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars to me paid by Joel Cherry of said district have granted bar-
gained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Joel Cherry all that piece parcel or tract of land containing two hun-
dred acres more or less situate on the north side of Twenty five mile Creek and the west side of Beaverdam branch beginning at a Beech corner about two hundred yards above the rock spring adjoining to Peter Felker on the south side Henry Hornes land on the west and north west being a part of two tracts of land one originally granted to John Martin deceased and the other to George Barsh then crosses said Beaverdam branch takes said branch for a line to General Bantys line along said line to land known by the name of Thompsons land thence to Winchester land and there corner and runs nearly a south coast a new line to be paid out by said cherry runs thence to the head of a hollow or branch to where it empties into the Beaverdam and then cor-
ners on an Oak. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining
