 of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred & Ninety one, and sixteenth year
 of the Independence of the united States of North America. Between -
 Alexander Glass of York County and State of South Carolina Planter of the
 one part, and Hugh Stevenson of the County and State aforesaid Planter of
 the other part. Witnesseth that the said Alexander Glass for and in consi-
 deration of the sum of Fifty eight pounds lawful money of the State aforesaid, to
 him in hand paid by the s^d Hugh Stevenson at and before the Unsealing, and de-
 livery of these presents, the receipt and payment whereof is hereby fully acknow-
 ledged, Hath Granted, Bargained, Sold, Aliened, Conveyed & Confirmed
 and by these presents doth Grant, Bargain, Sell, Alien, Convey & Confirm unto the
 said Hugh Stevenson his Heirs & Assigns forever, a certain Plantation Tract or parcel
 of Land, lying and being in the State & County aforesaid on the Waters of Allison's
 Creek, Beginning at a Post Oak on Samuel Currey's line and runs with William
 Barnhills Land N^E 40° S 105 poles to a Stake, thence with s^d Alexander Glass's
 Land S^E 50° S 299 poles to a Hickory at Adams's Land, thence with his Land
 S^E 68° W 120 poles to a Black Oak, thence with John M^cLaw's & Samuel Currey's
 Land N^E 50° W 200 poles to the beginning, containing by estimation one hundred
 & fifty acres, be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the
 Woods, underwoods, profits, commodities, advantages, Hereditaments, & Appurten-
 ances whatsoever to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining: and also
 the reversion and reversions, remainder & remainders, rents, issues, & profits thereof
 and all the Estate, Right, Title, Claim and Demand whatsoever of him the said
 Alexander Glass of, in and to the said Land & premises or any part thereof -
 To Have and to Hold the said Plantation or tract of one hundred & fifty acres of
 Land, with all & singular the premises & Appurtenances unto the s^d Hugh Stevenson
 his Heirs & Assigns, to the only proper use & behoof of him the said Hugh Stevenson his
 Heirs

Hairs and Affigns forever free and clear of all incumbrances whatsoever (the Taxes imposed by Government only excepted). And the said Alexander Glass the said Plantation or tract of Land with the premises & appurtenances, against him and his Heirs, and against all and every other person and persons whatsoever, unto the said Hugh Stevenson his Heirs & Affigns shall have Warrant and forever defend by these presents.
