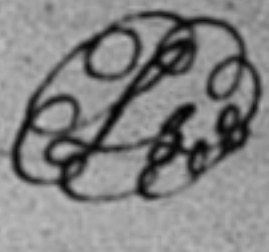

 Spinster have granted Bargained sold and released and conveyed unto the said Elizabeth Armstrong  
 and by these presents do Grant Bargain sell and release unto the said Elizabeth Armstrong all that Plantation  
 or Tract of Land containing One Hundred and sixty two & half Acres situated in said State and District  
 on the Waters of Fishing Creek (viz) Beginning at a Black Oak near the road to Gilman's Mill on  
 the School House all thence run N. 87° E. 27-90 to a pine thence S. 44° W. 51-36 to Stone cor thence  
 S. 67° E. 2 to a Black Gum thence S. 76° W. 25 to a Black Oak thence N. 48° W. 23-40 to a White oak  
 S. 55° E. 14 to a Black Oak thence N. 10° E. 34-60 to the Beginning it being part of a certain tract of Land  
 originally granted unto Hugh White deceased and by him it was conveyed unto James Armstrong deceased  
 who by his Last Will bequeathed it unto his son the said John Armstrong Together with all and  
 Singular the Rights Members Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging  
 in any wise Incident or Appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises

 clause and Sentence herein contained shall cease determine and be utterly void to all

 twenty six cents have granted Bargained sold and released and by these presents do Grant bargain sell  
 and release unto John Hart of the State and District aforesaid a certain Tract of Land situated in the  
 District and State aforesaid on the North fork of Fishing Creek joining John McCaw Esq. George Davis  
 and Others Beginning at an Oak on the bank of the Creek and running down the same the various courses  
 about twenty two poles to a Small post Oak thence N. 79° E. 18 poles to a Stake thence S. 85° E. 184 poles  
 to a Black Oak thence N. 1 1/2° W. 248 poles to a Black Oak thence N. 75° W. 112 poles crossing Adams branch  
 to a Small post Oak on the Bank thereof thence down the said Branch including the low grounds  
 the various courses 188 poles thence down the various courses of said Branch again including the low  
 grounds 72 poles thence S. 20° W. 15 poles to the beginning containing Two Hundred and twenty six Acres
