

and by these presents do Grant Bargain Sell and release unto the said Elizabeth Armstrong all that Plantation
or Tract of Land containing One Hundred and Sixty two & half Acres Situate in said State and District
on the Waters of Turkey Creek Beginning at a Black Oak near the road to Gilmore's Mill in
the School House also thence run N. 87° E 27.90 to a pine thence S. 4° W. 51.30 to Stone cor then
S. 67° E. 2 to a Black Gum thence S. 76° W. 25 to a Black Oak thence N. 48° W. 23.40 to a White oak
S. 55° E 14 to a Black Oak thence N. 10° E 34.60 to the Beginning it being part of a certain tract of land
originally granted unto Hugh White deceased and by him it was conveyed unto James Armstrong deceased
who by his Last Will bequeathed it unto his son the said John Armstrong together with all and


