This Indenture made and concluded on this 5th day of June and in the year of our Lord 1878 and of the Independence of the United States the 42th. Between E. Fowell of S. Carolina York District of the one part and Morning, Martin, Michael Martin, Mannow Martin, Morgan Martin & Mary Martin & Henry Ramsey of the other part; Witnesseth that for and in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars in hand paid by E. Fowell to the above Morning, Michael, Mannow, Morgan & Mary Martin and Henry Ramsey we do hereby convey unto s^d E. Fowell all the premises that is on a certain parcel of land and as much timber as he said E. Fowell may need from time to time for the use of the mining business but it is to be understood that we do not convey any part of the soil or the timber any further than above mentioned and also we do grant free privilege of water for uses above and also for a road or roads through our land to said Snow Mining s^d land having the following bounds, Beginning at a red oak being the upper corner of s^d tract of land from thence S 10 W 1st to Holland's Spring branch thence down said branch to Lion Moors creek, thence up said creek following the various forks of both branch & creek to the given line of s^d tract of land, thence N 10 E to an old pine corner, thence due west 17 chs to the beginning. it is to be understood that s^d Fowell or no other person for him is to make a road or roads through fields that is now cleared or may be hereafter cleared out of the above described parcel of land and in consideration of the above
