 Brison his Heirs & assigns forever, a certain tract
 or parcel of Land Situate in the County of State
 aforesaid & on both sides of Marks Fork Containing
 one hundred & ninety one Acres, be the same more
 or less, Beginning at a Red Oak & running thence
 N. 15 E 39 Chains to a Stake N. E. 76 distance 9. 5. Ch^s
 thence N. 64 W 28. to a hickory. thence N. 26 E 41. 50 Ch^s
 to a Red Oak, thence S. 74. W. 51. to a pine, thence S. 10. E
 40. to a black oak, thence N. 75 E 15. to a white oak; thence
