To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Know ye that in consideration of an Entry made in the Surveyors Office of the Sixth District of N^o 5282 dated the twenty sixth day of February 1818 founded on a Certificate of Number 1370 issued by the Register of East Tennessee to James P. Taylor for one hundred and twenty acres of land dated the thirty first day of October 1817. Twenty four acres of which are assigned to John Stuart the entire he is granted by the said State of Tennessee unto the said John Stuart and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty four acres lying in the County of Washington in said District on the waters of Big Limestone joining said Stuarts own land. Beginning at a stake in a field on a line of a fifty acre Survey of said Stuarts thence with a line of an hundred acre Tract of said Stuarts South sixty two & an half poles to a stake near a white Oak thence thence with another line of said hundred acres West eighty one poles to a stake thence North thirty five poles to a stake on a line of said fifty acre Survey thence with said line to the Beginning Surveyed October 27th 1818 with its appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances to the said John Stuart and his heirs forever in Witness whereof Joseph McMin Governor of the State of Tennessee hath hereunto set his hand and caused the great Seal of the said State to be affixed at Memphis on the first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen and of American Independence the forty fourth.

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Know ye that in consideration of an Entry made in the Surveyors Office of the Sixth District of N^o 753 dated the twentieth day of August 1811 founded on a Warrant of Number 2631 issued by John Carter to Thomas Rye for one hundred acres of land dated the twenty sixth day of December 1796 sixty acres of which are assigned to Michael Coffey the entire thence is granted by the said State of Tennessee unto the said Michael Coffey and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of land containing sixty acres lying in the County of Washington in said District on the South Side of Nolichucky River lying between the lands of John Rymore & Adam Painter including the house and Improvement whereon Michael Coffey lately lived. Beginning at a stake near Ten Black Oaks thence East
