

N<sup>o</sup>. 1 William Shirill two hundred and sixty one acres of land in Anson County beginning at a red Oak and runs West 200 pole to a pine then South 132 pole to a Sassafras then East 100 pole to a stake thence to the first Station Dated 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 1751.

N<sup>o</sup>. 33 John Stokes four hundred and twenty two acres of land in Anson County beginning at a gum on a hill on the North side of Richland Creek then E. 240 pole to B. then South 280 poles to C. then West 200 poles to D. then North 280 poles to A the first Station Dated 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1752.

N<sup>o</sup>. 89 John Sedwell six hundred and twenty acres of land in Anson County beginning on John Pikes line running East 5 chains then South 11 chains to a white Oak Bush then west 80 chaining to a hickory thence N. 82 chains and fifty links to a black Oak thence East to Pikes corner thence along his line to the first Station Dated 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1752.

N<sup>o</sup>. 113 William Shirill two hundred acres of land in Anson County on the south side of the Catawba River a bout a mile and a half below the Elk Shoals beginning at a red Oak on the River at the mouth of a small creek and runs W. 120 pole to a Stake then S. 270 pole to a Stake then E. 190 pole to a red Oak on the River then its several courses to the first Station Dated 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1752.

N<sup>o</sup>. 11 Timothy Ferrall two hundred and eighty acres of land in Anson County beginning at a white Oak on the east side of Pole Cat running thence West twenty chain to a black Oak thence South forty chain then East one hundred chain to a persimmon tree then North forty chain to a hickory then West twenty chain then South twenty chain then West Sixty chain then north twenty chain to the first Station Dated 24<sup>th</sup> day of June 1751.

N<sup>o</sup>. 22 John Thompson six hundred and forty acres of land in Anson County on both sides of the South fork, of fifth creek, above the mouth, beginning at a white Oak running W 320 pole to a white Oak then N 320 pole to a red Oak then E 320 pole to a white Oak then to the first Station Dated 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1752.

N<sup>o</sup>. 30 John Thompson six hundred and twenty seven acres of land in Anson County beginning at a hickory on the west side of Davison creek thence W 284 pole to a hickory in the line of me Docwell thence S. 354 pole to a white Oak corner to my Lord's manor then E. 248 pole then N. 354 pole to the first Station Dated 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1752.
