Cornelius Autry Three hundred and seventy six acres of land in Edgecombe County beginning at an Oak in Autry's Creek then S. 200 pole to a pine then E. 400 pole to a red Oak on Crawsaway Branch then N. 98 pole to a white Oak on the creek then up the creek to the first Station Dated 10th day of November 1755

Robert Brimbley Two hundred and fifty Acres of land in Edgecombe County on the south side of Fishing Creek opposite to Mr. Pollocks line beginning at a red Oak at the mouth of a hollow running west 240 pole to an Oak then N. 240 pole then E. 60 pole to the creek at a white Oak then the course of the creek S. 60 E. 80 pole to Pollocks line on the other side of the creek then S. 30 E. 230 pole to the first Station Dated 7th day of May 1757 —
