 West One hundred and eighty six poles to a black oak on said

 other line North Thirtysix West One hundred and fourteen poles to
 a large pine at the head of a Swamp his other corner, then South
 forty two West forty poles to a post oak on Thomas Robinson's line
 then along his line South twenty nine East two hundred and
 two poles to a post Oak at his Hickory corner, then with his
 other line South sixty West two hundred and twenty poles to
 a black Oak at his other corner crossing Indian Creek and
 a small Branch, then with his other line North thirty

I know you that We have granted unto Lewis Beard Seven hundred
and thirty six Acres of land in Lincoln County on the Waters of Buffalo
Creek coming Land of Jacob Bullinger, John Sloan, Crook Parker
and Robert Weir, Beginning at a post Oak Jacob Bullingers corner
and running thence nearly with said Weirs line South two hundred
poles to a pine on a Ridge crossing a Branch, thence South Seventy -
five degrees East Ninetytwo poles to a post Oak near Obrian land
thence nearly with his line South two hundred and twenty six
poles to a post Oak beside the Road leading from John to Peter
Beams crossing two branches of the muddy fork of Buffalo
thence East Seventy five Degrees West two hundred poles to a
post Oak near Crook Parkers line, thence nearly with his line
North ten degrees East One hundred sixty poles to a post Oak near
said Parkers corner Crossing two branches, thence with his line
South Eighty nine degrees West One hundred and fifty poles crossing
a Branch to a Chestnut his corner, thence West One hundred
and Sixty poles to a Stake, thence North two hundred and forty
poles to a Stake, thence East to the Beginning To Hold to the
