

To the Honorable the Members of the Senate & House of
Representatives of the State of South Carolina

The petition of John J. Abner the subscriber shows that on
the first Monday in September 1835 he did convey and delivered up to the purchaser three negroes
and that previous thereto he had sold and conveyed by deed his plantation containing one hundred
and sixty four acres - that your petitioner did
not deem it necessary to make a return of the
above property to the Tax Collector of York District
when he was collecting the last taxes as he was not
 liable legally to pay taxes for it having parted with
 it previous to the 1st of October and the tax collector
 not being aware of the fact, as your petitioner supposes
 issued his execution against your petitioner for a
 double tax on the aforesaid property amounting to
 \$100 dollars and thirty cents, which your petitioner
 has been compelled to pay to the Sheriff with costs, Your
 petitioner therefore prays that the said double
 tax and costs, wherein may be refunded and
 your petitioner will pray November 20th 1835
