A negro boy called Albert with the sum of one hundred and eighty three Dollars and thirty three Cents $\frac{2}{3}$ to be paid by Frederick L. P. Pico and John S. Fitzgibbons to the said Doctor Thos. Hall in right of his wife Martha C. Hall said to be retained by him as distributive share of the said property in manner aforesaid To Frederick L. Pico in right of his wife Amy Gillis, Pico a Negro Girl called Nizzy by paying the sum of one hundred and six ten Dollars. $66\frac{2}{3}$ Cents to Thos. Hall the said Negro Girl to be delivered to him as his distributive share of said estate on the payment being made as aforesaid To John S.
