personal Estate of the late Emily Fitzgibbons deceased shewn to us by Thomas
Hall administrator of said Emily Fitzgibbons in manner following
to wit. A negro boy called Albert with the sum of one hundred and
eighty three Dollars and thirty three Cents $\frac{1}{3}$ to be paid by Frederick L. I.
Pierce and John S. Fitzgibbons to the said Doctor Thos. Hall in right of
his wife Martha C. Hall and to be retained by him as distributive
share of the said property in manner aforesaid To Frederick L. I. Pierce
in right of his wife Amy Willis I. Pierce a Negro Girl called Nizzy by paying
the sum of one hundred and sixteen Dollars. 66 $\frac{2}{3}$ Cents to Thos. Hall
