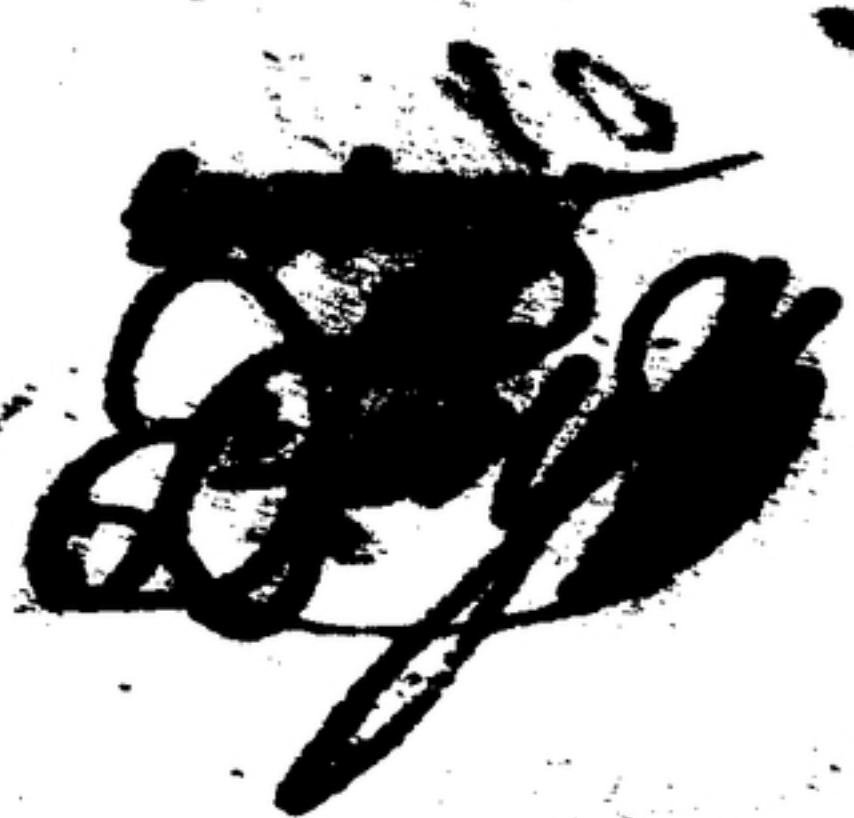

To the honorable the members of the House
of Representatives of the State of South
Carolina,

The humble petition of John Gibson

Sheweth,

That your petitioner early in the year
1861 was entered the militia of
this State as a common soldier and
under the command of Mr. Bryan of Edgefield
District, and that he performed several
tours of duty under the aforesaid Capt.

Bryan, was at the siege of Augusta
and the battle of Stone Mountain after the death

of Bryan he was under the command
of Capt. Cain of the 1st South Carolina
Infantry. That he was also in three expedi-

tions against the Cherokee Indians
under the immediate command of

Captains Bryant, Cain and Dawson and
under the command of General Williams

and General Pickens, was present when
the final treaty was made at High-

water with the Indians by General
Sheridan and Pickens, and on short

notice engaged in almost every tour of
duty that was performed by the militia

from this section of the country.

more fully appear by the affidavits hereunto
annexed; (and a number more could be obtained
if your petitioners conceived it necessary,
Your petitioners well hoped that he never
would have been reduced to the necessity of
applying to the Board of his country
for assistance, but age and misfortune
have reduced him to poverty; (being now
over seventy years of age;) and there is no
where he can look with so much certan-
ty for assistance as to that country, that
he expects by redeeming from British
bondage, and placing him in that high
flourishing and independent situation
which she now enjoys.
Your petitioners therefore hope that your
honorable body will take his case into
consideration, and grant him such relief
by placing him on the pension list or other
wise, as your honorable body may think
proper, and your petitioners as in du-
ty bound will ever pray.
