Item I Give to my daughter Anna Morgan the wife of Parker Morgan One set of Blacksmiths Tools, also one feather Bed and furniture to be enjoyed and Received at my decease.

Item I Give and devise all the remaining part of my Estate after the death of my wife Jenny Olover to my two daughters, Mary Bowman the wife of Nathaniel Bowman and Jemietty the wife of Elijah Reed, to be Equally divided between them share and share alike.

And Lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my dear wife Jenny Olover my Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other former wills by me made, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twelfth day of July One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Seven 1797

I humbly I give & commend my Soul into the hands of God who gave
my Body to the dust of the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian like
manner at the discretion of my Executors after mentioned - & as to such worldly
as it has pleased God to bless me, I give devise and bequeath in manner
& form following. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

First I give bequeath to my Grandson Boaz Burrows the sum of ~~William Burrows~~
~~the sum of~~ five Pounds to be paid to his said father in one year after my
my decease - Also to my Grand Daughter Elizabeth Burrows ^{Daughter of Benjamin Burrows} the like sum
of five Pounds to be paid to her father in one year after my decease - Also to my
Grandson Alexander Manlove Son of George Manlove the like sum of five pounds
to be paid to his said Father in one year after my decease. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Secondly I give bequeath to my Niece Magdalene Manlove my Blue bandlet Gown
& ~~my~~ ^{my} ~~bandlet~~ ^{bandlet} ~~gown~~ ^{gown} *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Thirdly I give bequeath the remainder of my wearing apparel to be divided as follows
between my daughter Sarah Williams & my Grand Daughter Sarah Burrows & to
my Daug. Sarah I give my silk cloak & to my Grand daughter Sarah I give
my Velvet cloak & all the remainder of my wearing apparel to be equally
divided between them by the Wife of William Burrows & Benjamin Burrows
as that my daughter Sarah shall have her first choice - Also I give to my
Grand daughter Sarah Burrows the Trundle Bed whereon she now lies
with the covering belonging to it & my riding saddle. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Fourthly My Will & desire is that my Negro Sam shall be hired out untill he attain
the age of twenty five years this hire to be applied to the support of my Negro
Woman called Sarah & if the said Negro Sarah should live longer than till
the said Sam should attain the age of 25 then & in that case the said Sam
shall still be hired out untill Sarah's decease & then be free. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Fifthly My Will & desire is that my Negro Boy Tobe shall be hired out untill he attain
the age of twenty five years when he be free & the first ten Pounds of his said hire to
be equally divided between Susannah Mason & James Williams the children of my
Daughter Sarah to be paid to their Guardian or father as soon as it shall be earned
the residue of his hire to go into my Estate not yet disposed of. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Sixthly My Will & desire is that my Negro Man London shall be free after the Payment of
Twenty one pounds four Shillings - & all my other negroes not mentioned shall be free
immediately after my decease. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Seventhly My Will & desire is that my negro Woman Sarah shall be left in the hands of my
Executors hereafter mentioned to be put to some good home & the hire of Negro
Sam to be applied to her support and maintenance. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Eighthly I give bequeath the residue & remainder of my Estate to be equally divided
between my children Viz William Burrows, Benjamin Burrows, Sarah Williams
& the children of George Manlove by my daughter Mary to have a child's part of
the children of Jonathan Burrows to have a child's part also. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*

Ninthly I nominate constitute & appoint my Sons William Burrows & Benjamin Burrows
my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament. *Witness my hand & seal the 10th day of June 1744*
