Item I give to Mary my well beloved wife the use of my Dwelling Plantation being in two Tracts for the use of and Support of my infirm Son John Vinkirk to be by them or either of them during their natural Life or lives enjoyed.

Item I give to my well beloved Son Barnard Vinkirk this my said Plantation being in two Tracts after the decease of my said wife and my said Son John to him my said Son Barnard Vinkirk and his lawful Heirs begotten of his Body for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Vinkirk One hundred Acres of Land which I bought of Joseph Suddell I give it to my said Son William to him and his lawful Heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Mary Vinkirk the

the Sum of Five Pounds and no more it being to be paid to her by my Executors when she arrives to the Age of Eighteen years or

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William One Black Horse Colt also one Bed and furniture

Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary One Grey Mare

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Barnard one Bay Mare and and if she be with foal it is my will and desire to give the Colt to my Daughter Rachel Havels and no more

Item I give to my Daughter Polly Vankirk the Sum of Twenty Pounds in Cash to be put to use by my Executors till the said Child comes to Age

Item I give and leave unto my said wife Mary the the One third part of all my Goods not yet disposed of, and the other two thirds to be equally divided among my Children Viz.

John & William & Barnard & Polly

And I do make nominate and appoint my dear and well beloved wife Mary the whole and sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament and I do utterly revoke and disallow all and every other former Wills Testaments and Legacies Confirming this and none other to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year above written signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us

declare the within written to be his Last will and Testament, and that at the doing thereof he was to the best of their knowledge of a sound and perfect mind memory and Judgment and that they and each of them together with William Loftland Jun^r subscribed the same as Evidence in presence of the Testator and at his Request

And I do hereby authorize and empower my Executor hereafter mentioned to make sale of all my moveable Estate and discharge all my lawful Debts with the same and after such discharge being made my desire is that the surplus if any there be to be equally divided between the afo^r Mary Walker Daughter of George Walker and Alexander Reid Son of Alexander Reid to them to be equally divided in the space of Twelve Months after my decease.

And I do hereby appoint my trusty friend James Walker my whole and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby disannul all other Wills by me made and acknowledged this to be my Last will and Testament
