In the Name of God Amen this Twelfth day of March
Seventeen Hundred & Fifty Five I Henry Paeriton Sen^r of the County of
Sussex being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory
thanks be Given to Almighty God for the Same therefore calling to mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men
Once to die do make and Ordain this my Last will and Testament that is
to Say Principally and first of all I Give and Recommend my soul into
the hands of God that Gave it and my body to the Earth to be Buried in
a Christian Like and Decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executors
Nothing Doubting but at the Generall Resurrection I shall receive the Same
Again by the mighty power of God and as Touching what worldly Estate
it hath pleased God to bestow upon me within this Life I Give Devise & Dispose

of In the following manner and form —

Item I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Margaret Angrave
Bridle and side saddle to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I Give and bequeath unto my loving Son William Borton
all my Turners Tools to him and his Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my well beloved Son William Borton
my Land and plantation Now Live on containing One Acre
and Fifty Acres with all the Appurtenances thereto belong-
ing to him and his Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my well beloved Daughter Mo-
nition One feather Bed and furniture One Iron yearn bed
and Twenty Shillings in ready money to her & her Heirs forever —

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son in Law Thomas Borton
Shilling in cash to him and his Heirs forever I do have the part
of this my Estate —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Henry Borton One Shilling
in cash to him and his Heirs forever I do have the part of this my Estate —

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Son in Law Benj. Borton
Shilling in cash to him and his Heirs forever I do have the part of this my Estate —

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Sarah Borton
in cash to her and her Heirs forever I do have the part of this my Estate —

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Patience Baycock One
Shilling in cash to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Three Children Hannah Baycock
William Borton and my little Daughter Mary Borton all

The rest and residue of my personal Estate of what kind soever after
 my Just Debts and funeral Charges are paid to be Equally Divided
 Among them and my wives Thirds Taken Out to them the aforesaid
 their Heirs forever Likewise I constitute and Appoint my well
 Beloved wife Margaret ~~and~~ my well beloved son William Brewster
 my whole and Sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament
 utterly Disannulling and revoking all other former wills Legacies
 and Bequeaths of what kind soever by me before this Time Made or
 willed and Bequeathed ratifying and Confirming this and No other to
 be my Last will & Testament In Testimony whereof I have here
 unto Set my hand and Affixed my Seal the day and year first within written
 Signed Sealed published and pronounced ^{this} Henry H. Brewster
