Draper his heirs and assigns forever one feather bed and
mattress &c that is all covering necessary and
what I have laid out towards his & well to sleep
that is bedding except the paying for the Oakum
Saw and boat Waile -

I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac
Draper his heirs and assigns forever the sum of
Twenty pounds worth money of America and the
feather bed and furniture to be used -

I give my will and desire is that my said
son Isaac Draper pay off and
discharge the said mortgage to the Bank Office of
this County for the Land I have given to them -

I give and bequeath unto my son Isaac Draper

and the grounds to support money of America and
