them to make and ordain this my last will and test-
ament in manners and form following: Resolving and
disannulling by these presents all and sundry other wills
or wills I have made or made by me here before made
and also that to be my last will: I therefore do hereby
bequeath my soul to God who made it and my body
there and return thereof, the interment with a Christian
rite and my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian
burial at the discretion of my executor hereafter mentioned
and as touching my worldly goods that it is the pleasure
God to give me with a good conscience to give to my dear
sons following: I say -

I give and bequeath unto my dear son
George Chamberlain the plantation whereon I now live
with one hundred and eighty eight acres or more there-
unto belonging to be held and enjoyed by him and his heirs
and assigns forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George
Chamberlain the parcel of land lying on the east side which
I purchased of John Smith to him: his heirs assigns forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George
Chamberlain five easy pieces of land with one hundred
and one acres of timber two hundred and thirty acres of
him and his heirs forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George
Chamberlain one negro man called Tom to him and his heirs
and assigns forever -

I then give and bequeath that my son George Chamberlain
may be at age and for himself at eighteen years of age
that he may receive his portion and be settled forever
with his land and plantation with his children forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George Chamberlain
one negro girl called Betsy her and her
increase to be held and enjoyed by her and her heirs
and assigns forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George Chamberlain
Elizabeth Chamberlain one negro girl called Fanny her
increase to be held and enjoyed by her and her heirs
and assigns forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George Chamberlain
my Prudence Chamberlain one negro woman called John
during her natural life and after her decease to be equally
divided between my three aforesaid children George Chamberlain
and Elizabeth to them and their heirs forever -

I then give and bequeath unto my son George Chamberlain
one Gray mare and her increase to her and her
heirs forever -
