In the Name of God Amen this Seventh day of February 1789 I Jonathan Bryan of the County of Sussex being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for the same, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but that at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Item I give and bequeath to Ann Bryan my dearly beloved daughter All my Estate that I am now possessed with after my Just debts is Paid &c. // // //

Memorandum the 23. day of March 1789 before me Phillips Kollocke Register appointed for the Probate of Wills and granting Letters of Administration for the County afo. appeared Milby Simpler and William Matthews, two of the Witnesses subscribing to the within Will who being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God did severally depose and say that in their sight Presence and hearing the testator Jonathan Bryan did sign, seal, Publish and declare the same to be his Last Will and Testament, and that at the doing thereof he was of a sound and perfect mind memory and Judgment, and that they and each of them subscribed the same as Witnesses in presence of the testator and at his request

In the Name of God Amen September the Second day Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and seventy eight I Rachel Hazard of the County aforesaid being of sound mind, memory and understanding thanks be to Almighty God for the same, therefore taking into Consideration the uncertainty of human life, and being willing and desirous to settle my Worldly affairs. Do hereby make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following

First that all my just debts and funeral Charges be paid, and the remainder of my Estate be disposed of in the manner following

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joseph Hazard One Negro Man named Cudge, One Bed and Beaf with Bolster, two Pillows, one Rug, one Blanket and one pair of Sheets, to him and his Heir for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my two Grand daughters, Elizabeth Stockley, and Mary Fidd, fourhead of sheep
