In the Name of god the twenty ninth day of october one
Thousand Seven hundred and fifty eight in the
County of beaufort I George Sugg being very Sick
and weak in body but of perfect mind and reason
mory thanks be to god there fore calling to mind
The mortality of my body and knowing that it is
appointed once for all men to dye doe make and or
dain this my last will and Testament That is to
say principally and first of all I give and
Recommend my Soul into the hands of god that
gave it and my body I Recommend to the Earth
To be buried in a decent Christian burial at the
decretion of my Ex^{ors} nothing doubting but at
The general Resurrection I shall Receive the
Same by the mighty power of god as touching
Such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased
god to bless me with in this life I give and dispose
of the Same in the follow manner and form

I give and give to my Son Nimrod Sugg all my Land
on the South Side of Lion Creek beginning at the
Second bottom above the clearing where Thomas
Gindesley Cowden is now I likewise give him fifty
pounds

I give my daughter Fanney Sugg one negro wench
named wile & one negro girl named ~~latter~~ Cree
them & their Successors for ever
I give my daughter Sarah Sugg two negro girls now
owned by herself them & their Successors for ever
I give to my wife Judith Sugg for her maintenance
five pounds per year during her life

my desire is that the negroes shall be kept at the
Plantation in order to provide for the Children
and to raise money to School them Five

I desire that my Ex^{ors} shall take out a deed for the
place where peter martine now lives and give him
a deed for the Same

I likewise desire they shall out a deed of Land
on the South Side of Tar river beginning at beginning
Swamp line and make a deed to some person or
persons Randol worth say thirty pounds and like
wise take out a deed for the Land for mowed and
a deed of the remainder of that land To Thomas Tindley
when he pay for the Cost of taking of it was
also to find money for John Joyner & John Brannon
to take out each of them a deed

I empyrion and leave all the rest of my real and personal Estate
to be after my debts is paid to be Equally divided between
my Daughter Lucey Tison Joel Sugg or Allen Sugg
or Sumner Sugg Sarah Sugg or George Sugg Doonaka
and or dain Aquilla Sugg Abraham Tison or my two
sons Joel Sugg or Allen Sugg my Executors
of this my last will and Testament and goe here by
utterly Dislow Revoke Disannul all and Every other former
Testament will legacies Executors by me any ways before
named with and Legacies Ratifying and Confirming

This and or other to be my last will and Testament
