in North Carolina being of sound mind & understanding do make
and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in
manner and form following that is to say First
I commend my Soul to God Almighty and my Body
I commit to the Earth to be decently Buried at the
Discretion of my Executors and Executrix

Herein after named, And as touching the Disposition
of my Worldly Estate I give and Dispose thereof as follows

Item, I Will that all my Just Debts and Funerall Charges
be paid and discharged by my Executors & Executrix
Herein after named, And I give and Bequeath to

my Loving Son William Bryan one Acre of Land
situate in the County of Currituck

ly known by the name of
my demesne tenement

and lying
at the On Gore creek that becom in Order to Defray
the expense of the Doct.^r & Funerall expenses,

Item, I give & Bequeath to my Loving Brother John
Bryan one Lot in the Town of Newbern
near Near the Gate Westerly,

Item I give and Bequeath to my Loving Mother
William John Bryan, half a Lot in the Town of
Newbern joining Thos. Setgrevs Lot near the
Western Gate.

Item, I give and Bequeath to my Loving nephew
Thomas Setgrevs one Front Lot in Newbern
on North Side of the Town,

I do hereby make
Witness my hand

My Dearest and
Will that all the Residue of my Estate be equally
Divided amongst my Children and Mother or to
to pay my Debts if my Land or Personal Estate should
not be sufficient, And I do hereby Revoke
Disannul and make Void all former and other
Wills & Testaments by me at any time heretofore
made in any manner whatsoever, And Declare
this Only to be and contain my last Will and
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal the 25th Day
of August 1791
