I give & bequeath to my son John Parkam Eighty three acres of
Land adjoining of Michael Wood Land. I give & bequeath to my
son Samuel Parkam Eighty three acres of Land. Likewise I give
& bequeath to my son Mathew Parkam Eighty three acres of Land.
I give & bequeath to my son George Parkam Eighty three acres of ~~Land~~
The rest three of my sons I leave all in one tract & they to divide
& if one of them should die the Land to be divided between the other
two. My Cumberland Land I leave to be sold to pay my debts
I give & bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Parkam my Horses Cattle
Hogs & Sheep & all my now & late Furniture. & Plantation working
Tools.
