The execution of the foregoing last will  
and Testament of Thomas Blackwell Slid. was duly proven  
an oath in open Court by Thomas L King one of the Subscri-  
bing Witnesses thereto, who also Swoor that John K Jones signed  
the same in his presence - And John K Jones the other Sub-  
scribing Witness thereto being a resident of the state of Tennessee,  
Robert Jones came into Court and made oath that the signature  
"John K Jones" is in the proper handwriting of John K Jones, on  
motion it is ordered to be recorded - At the same time came forward  
William Hilliard & William Blackwell named as Executors in said  
Will, and renounced their right to qualify as such - Whereupon  
James Woghe was appointed Administrator with the will annexed  
who entered into bond in the sum of \$50,000 with W Blackwell,  
John Blackwell, Jonathan Blackwell, Gideon H. Macon &  
Fryon Gamay Securities and duly qualified as such -

In the name of God, Amen: I Nathan Baps of the County  
of Granville State of North Carolina being of sound mind &  
disposing memory do ordain this to be my last, & Testament re-  
voking all former will by me made -  
1st I want all my just debts paid by my Executor hereafter named,  
for him to sell such property as I shall not hereafter will for  
the payment of my debts -  
I give & bequeath unto my wife Martha Baps one Desk, one  
bed & necessary furniture, one Spinning wheel, one Clay wheel,  
one Saddle, one pot oven, one set of knives & forks, half dozen  
Pates plates, two Decanters, one Tub & pail - I also loan unto  
my wife Martha Baps during her life Ten acres of land to include  
the dwelling house that I now live in & also the out houses, to be laid  
off as she may think proper (reserving one acre of land around  
the Grave-Yard for a family burying ground) and I loan her  
my still during her life and at her death I give the above still & ten  
acres of land to Warner Tanner better known by the name of Warner  
Bap to him this heirs forever -

2nd I give & bequeath unto the aforesaid Warner Tanner all of that part  
of my land lying South of the Big path running from William  
Bradford to Mrs Ann S Taylor in the tract I now live on to the  
line of Lewis Peford, one Black horse, which he has now in  
possession, one cart, and one half Doz. Pates plates to him this

hers forever - 4" I give & bequeath unto Lewis Petiford who married my daughter Ezra fifty acres of land be the same more or less being the land on which the said Petiford now lives bounded by the land of Joshua Hutchinson due sothys and one Pot to him his heirs forever -

5" I give and bequeath unto my daughter Honore Jones that part of my land not already devised (that is) all on the East side of the Pathway from my house to William Clements to her other heirs forever -

6" I give & bequeath to my son Jeps Bap five Shillings to him his heirs forever -

7" I give & bequeath to my Grandson Samuel Valentine five Shilling to him his heirs forever -

8" I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sally Petiford five Shillings to her other heirs forever - all the property that I have not named in the above will I want my Executor to sell and if there should be more than will pay my debts I want it equally divided between my wife Martha Warner Tiner - I the said Nathan Bap do hereby appoint William Bradford Executor to this my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> day January A.D. 1835.
