I will that Elizabeth my wife will possess & enjoy all my land goods & gear whatsoever during her single life providing always that she is bound to pay the particular sums & fulfill the particular conditions here after mentioned First she is to pay ten Shillings to James Campbell, ten Shillings to Pelly, Ten Shillings to Colin Campbell, ten Shillings to Donald ten Shillings to Duncan, ten Shillings to John, ten Shillings to Betty ten Shillings to Annie & ten Shillings to George Campbell my Children & that of the Currency of the Province also to pay all the debts the family is or will be owing at the time of my decease, and the said Elizabeth my wife is bound by her signing these presents not to spend gift or bestow share or impart any of the land goods & gear above mentioned to any person or persons whatsoever but my Children. Excepting what is consistent with common humanity, but she is to dispose of the same at the time of her decease to my Children according to the private Injunctions given her to that purpose and in case she may be seized with sickness or otherwise rendered incapable to care or notice her own person or affairs in which the said land & others above mentioned is to be appropriated for to support & maintain her and further it is agreed upon by the said Elizabeth my wife that in case she marries then she is to have for a Bed a Horse to Ride the best Bed in the house a Milk Cow or a Cow & calf & the land to be the property of George my youngest son all other goods & gear to be divided among the most needy of my Children the most of which to Betty that is to be done as the Elizabeth think it most needful, and it is agreed upon by the said Elizabeth his wife in case it so happens that the said Archibald Campbell should survive her then & in that case by her signing these presents appoints him & unrevocable Legator her Heir - I nominate & appoint the said Elizabeth my wife Executors & my sons Colin Campbell & Duncan Campbell Executors, Confirming this to be our last will & Testament in witness whereof we have wrote set our hand & seal this 19th of March in the year of our Lord 1782
