I have remembered that I John Deady of Wakeham County, Carolina, being to an old age and of a feeble mind & memory considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of a good & perfect mind and memory blessed be God, in the evening I do make & publish this my last will & Testament in manner & form following
That is to say, first, I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Generva Deady the whole benefit of my plantation to raise the children & all farming utensils & the two portions & the third of the cattle & livestock one year previous said of, in the support of the family & one third of the stock in \$100. livestock and all household, as situated & appurtenances of the family and if any of my children marries what they get by the value & counted in their share of the same & the same as their lands & other property that is named is from my value & value, all payable, as far as to be sold at my decease & in my own and what is my is found in hand, all to be equally divided amongst my wife & children and at the decease of my wife or children all the remainder of property to be sold & equally divided amongst all my children & my wife if married a child part of the land & livestock the land not to be sold or divided until the children all come of age & being of the age of twenty & every ten lifetimes to be divided by valuation equal amongst boys & girls - I do hereby appoint & name Thomas & Abraham Deady to be executors of my will and Testament in the County of Wakeham whereof I am the decedent this 12th day of September in the year of our Lord 1781

of this mortal life, and being of sound & perfect mind and
memory before God, in the same, I do make & publish this
my last will & Testament in manner & form following
That is to say, first, I give & bequeath unto my beloved
wife Germina Bealy the whole benefit of my plantation
to raise the children & all farming utensils & the two best
horses & the third of the cattle & likewise one year provisions
laid off for the support of the family & one third of the stock &
Hogs, Litter and all household, or other to be kept, in the
use of the family and if any of my children marries
what they get may be valued & counted in their share
& Abraham & Thomas their lands & other property that
is named to them by valuation, all payable, so far
as to be sold at my decease & my wagon and what is my
is found in hand, all to be equally divided amongst my
wife & children and at the decease of my wife or marriage
all the remainder of property to be sold & equally divided
amongst all my children & my wife if marries a child
part of the land likewise the land not to be sold out until
when the children all come of age laying off the remainder
Downy two lifetimes to be divided by valuation equally
amongst boys & girls - I do hereby appoint & give
Thomas & Abraham Bealy to be Executors of my last will
and Testament in Witness whereof I set my hand
& seal this the 12th day of September in the year of our Lord 1818
