I William Bryant Esq, of the County of Nash and State of North Carolina, being in low state of health but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, do this the twenty sixth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six make publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit. First: I lend to my beloved wife Polly Bryant during her natural life the following negroes one negro man named Jacob and one named Ben and two women one named Patience and one named Easter and boy named Tom also two hundred of horses six cows and calves one yoke of oxen and cart twenty five chickens six swine and pigs twelve of geese and one riding chair and gear one man saddle, one still and all of my brandy and other drink and all my necessary working tools sufficient for me to be judge of by my executors also I lend to my wife Polly Bryant her life time one feather bed and furniture of her

own choice and all the rest of my household and kitchen furniture of every description except my beds also I allot to my beloved wife one years provisions for herself and family out of my estate to be laid out by my executors and the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid her by my executors in money. Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Patsey Rice the following negroes to wit: one negro woman named Silvy one named Charlott one girl named Vilet one woman named Darcas, one girl named Aneky, one named Charity, and six boys, one named Joe, Jacob Anthony, Isaac and Sallomon and Lewis another girl named Hasty all the stock and other property which I lent to my said daughter Patsey Rice that is now in her possession I give to her and to her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Sally Strickland the following negroes to wit one negro woman named Vilet, one named Phillis one named Maty and one named Millie and a boy named Stephen also all the stock and property which I have lent to my said daughter Sally Strickland that is now in her possession I give to her and to her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved son Wm. Bryant the following negroes to wit One man named Abraham and one named Amos, one girl named Vilet one woman named Celia one girl named Litha also all of my land to be equally divided between my sons William and Evans Bryant as near as can be in quantity and value so as for my son William to have the land he son he now lives and the land on Sapponey swamp all so all the stock and other property which I have lent to my son William that is now in his possession I give to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I send to my beloved daughter Rhody Whithite during her natural life after her death to be equally divided between her heirs lawfull be- gotten of her bodie if she should have any living at her death if none to return and be equally divided among the rest of my children the following negroes. to wit One boy named Little Jacob Henry one woman named Nanner one girl named Maty one girl named Hixy and her increase. Also I give to my daughter Rhody Whithite the following property viz: one boy named Dennis one two year old filly called the Rix filly his saddle and bridle & head of sheep and all the rest of the property that she may be in the possession of to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I send to my beloved daughter Susan Upchurch during her natural life after her death to be equally divided among her children lawfully be- gotten of her bodie if there be any living at her death if none to return and be equally divided among the rest of my children viz: One boy named Dennis one girl named Ephraim one woman named Ciley also I also give to my daughter Susan Upchurch the property that One girl named Ciley and the rest of the property in my possession of to her and her heirs forever.

Item: I give and bequeath to my beloved grand children John Rice, Jiney Rice, Nicholosen Rice, Berry Rice, and Boykin Rice, children of my daughter Elizabeth Rice now dead the following negroes to wit; one named Clatty and child Morning, Liza one named Cresa one Alsey Atsy boy named Jackson and ~~Unraised~~ which negroes is to be equally divided between the above named children as they arrive of lawful age and not to be finally devidied at first but to divide them as they come of age each his part in case the above named children shall all die with out lawfull begotten heirs of their boddie then the above named negroes will to them decend to and be equally divided unto all of my children. If any of my said grand children before named shall die before they arrive of lawfull age then the said negroes willed to them to be equally divided among the surviving one, Item: I give to my son and law Benjamin Rice the sum of five dollars to be paid him in money by my executors.

Item: I give to my son and law Josiah Vick the sum of five dollars to be paid him in money by executors and all the stock and other property which I lent him now in his possession.

Item: My will and desire is that the following negroes should be sold by my executors on twelve months credit to ~~vit~~ Dave and Little Dave Jinny and her two children, Liza and Munidy.

Item: All the rest of my negroes which I have not named in my will I leave to be equally divided among the following children Jency Bryant Eavins Bryant and Delany Bryant also I give and bequeath to my last named children one feather bed and furniture each the negroes which I give to my last named children is not to be divided untill they become of age or should marry them as they arive of age or marry to draw his equal part from my executors if any of the said children should die not leaving a lawfull begotten heir of their boddie then the property should decend and be equally divided among the rest of my children all of my property which I do not dispose of in the will I leave to be sold by my executors and after paying my just debts and satifying my executors for their trouble the ballance of which I leave to be equally divided between my children Patsey Rice, Sally Strickland, William, Hoby Jency Susan Eavins and Delaney Bryant.

Item: I give and bequeath to my son Eavins Bryant one sorrell filly named Bounce saddle and bridle also the land whereon I now live after the death of my wife she is to have the land whereon I now live after it is divied her life time. If my son Eavins should die with out leaving any lawfull begotten heir then the land which I give him and I spend to my son will to Bryant and his heirs.

Item: After the death of my life wife Bryant the property which I leave to her for the term of her life I dispose of in the following
