I William Wade of the State of
North Carolina and County of North-
ampton, being weak and sick
in body but of sound mind and
memory do make and ordain
this to be my last will and testa-
ment. I do hereby declare
first I wish my several debts
to be paid out of my Estate
secondly I give and bequeath
unto my wife Elizabeth Wade
all the remainder of my property
of every description to have
and to dispose of in any manner
she may think proper during
her life or at her death.

In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my
seal this first day of March
One Thousand Eight hundred

and sixty four in presence
of ~~John~~ William Trade ~~and~~
J. R. Drake X
Jeremiah Gay X

Northampton County Sept. Court 1864.

will and testament of William Trade is
