Ebenezer Sutton

Protest

Dated 30 April 81  
1811

In the name of god amen I Ebinger Sevton of  
the state of North Carolina and county of Pittsford  
being in an advanced period of life and in a weak and low  
condition and as it is appointed for all men to die hath  
constituted and ordained this my last will and testament

And after my decease I desire that my body may be in-

terred in Christian and decent manner ~~and all~~

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth  
Sevton all the whole of my goods ab estate should she  
survive me and I leave her to her own choice to which  
of her children <sup>she</sup> will live which property shall be to  
her support and also one hundred acres of land I require  
my Executor to make sale off and apart for to defray  
funeral expences and a part to pay the legacies the  
remaining part shall go to the of my widow.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> And as for my beloved children viz Benjamin  
Sevton William Sevton John Sevton Martha  
Buckham Ebinger Sevton Thomas Sevton  
and George Sevton I will and bequeath them  
of one dollar <sup>per ann</sup> to each of them which I consider  
as sufficient to discharge me from any further duty  
or obligation to them.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> As for my suit by attachment now in law should  
the same be recovered I will and bequeath the recoverd  
sum unto <sup>my exec</sup> Ebinger Sevton two children viz  
John Sevton & Bolter Sevton to be equally re-  
divided between them and I do here by ~~constitute~~

and ordain my son William Sevton my lawfull  
Executor as witness my hand and seal this 29<sup>th</sup>

day of April 18<sup>th</sup>
