Fenner as my executors to carry this my last will into effect and I hereby authorize them to make deeds unto my children aforesaid, to whom I have bequeathed land, and to such other persons as may purchase of my real estate, after my decease agreeable to the directions of this my last will and testament, which deeds so executed by my executors aforesaid shall be considered good and valid in law to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
