IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, I Luke Whitfield Sen. of Prince George Parish Craven County in the Province of South Carolina being indisposed of Body but of Perfect mind but knowing that there is nothing so certain as death and nothing so uncertain as the Hour thereof, Therefore I do make and constitute this my Last Will and Testament revoking annulling and make Void all other Wills, Codicils and Gifts in case of death but will that this my Last Will and Testament may stand and in its Force and Virtue First of all I commit my spirit to the Hands of Almighty God hoping for a Resurrection at Last day and my Body to the Earth to be decently interred of my executors hereafter Named discretion nothing doubting but I shall receive the same at the Resurrection of the great day and be again Reunited by the Almighty power of God and as for such worldly goods as it please God Almighty to endow me with, I do hereby dispose in manner and form following. First of all I give and bequeath to my Loving wife Chloe Whitfield the plantation I now live on and Crop on the said plantation all my Stock of Horses Cattle and Hogs, Sheep and Geese and all my Household Furniture and One Negroe Fellow Named Moly and my debts being paid out of my Wife Chloe Whitfields part of my Estate, Secondly I give and bequeath to my two youngest daughters Penelepe Whitfield and Terecy Whitfield at their Marriage or when they come of age One Negroe Wench Named vilet and one Negroe girl Named Sal they and their In from this day to be equally divided with the two Girls Penelepe and Terecy Whitfield wife Chloe Whitfield having the use of the above Named Negroe Wench Vilet her life time, Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Luke Whitfield Jun. One Negroe Boy Named Daniel, Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Moody One Negroe Boy Named Simon, Fifthly I give and bequeath the following Negroes One wench Named Cate, One Girl Named Jude One Girl Named Dol and One Girl Named Phillis, One Boy Named Tim One Boy Named Mingo and One Boy Named Tom they and their increase from this day to be equally divided between my Four Youngest Sons as they come of Age, -Liam Whitfield Matthew Whitfield,

 and beloved Son Luke Whitfield Jun. Executor and my beloved
 Friend Aaron Daniel, hoping and well Afsured that they will
 in conjunction do their utmost Endeavour to have every Article
 and Clause therein Contained performed and fulfilled. IN WIT-
