I Peter Nuykendael of the State and County aforesaid being sick and in a low state of health but in perfect mind and memory thanks to God for it with all others his mercies calling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it was appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my test will and testament. and principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God who gave it nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by his almighty power as to my body I command it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like and decent burial at the discretion of my Executors and as touching of such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner First I give and bequeath that tract or parcel of land whereon I now live and on my boy named Harry to my well beloved son Ipe Nuykendael. Secondly I give & bequeath to my well beloved daughter Jane Nuykendael one Negro named Dick also I give and bequeath to my beloved son Adam Nuykendael five Shilling Star, I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Young the sum of one Shilling Star, I give & bequeath to my son Mathew Nuykendael the sum of one Shilling Star, I give & bequeath to my son Peter Nuykendael the sum of one Shilling Star, and the remaining part of my estate after the discharge of all my Just debts I do Ordain that it shall be divided among six of my children (Wife) Mary Nuykendael Ruth Nuykendael Peter Nuykendael Offay Nuykendael Ipe Nuykendael and Jane Nuykendael and I do Ordain and constitute my Executors to be

Baptist McNabb Will

In the name of God Amen This fourth day of January in the year of
Our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and eighty four Baptist McNabb
of the County of Washington and State of North Carolina being sick & weak in body
but of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of this my life
and that it is appointed for all men once to die. do make and Order this to be
my last will and testament That is to say principally and first of all I recommend
my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent &
christian manner at the direction of my executors and further such worldly
goods whereunto it pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose of in manner as
followeth: First of all I Order and it is my will that all my Last & lawful debts
and funeral charges be paid of by my executors — I do give and bequeath unto my
daughter Isabella McNabb my two Mares and colts and furniture one cow
and calf such as now got two more her choice of the Stock at my decease & all
and every part of my household furniture — I do likewise Order that my executors
make a writ to the tract of land that I gave to my son John McNabb & likewise
to that tract I gave my son David McNabb, the other parts where I now live on I do
give unto my son Jonathan McNabb and his heirs with its improvements upon condition
that it be valued by three indifferent persons to be chosen by the legates he having two
legates parts the other parts to be paid in manner following — In one year after my
decease that is to say to W^m McNabb John McNabb David McNabb & Isabella McNabb
and in case that he should refuse to take said land on those conditions that it be
sold and the money arising therefrom be divided amongst the legates in manner
aforesaid — And that all the Stock and moveables not otherwise divided be sold,
and equally divided between amongst the legates and in case Isabella McNabb
should die in her non age that her part should be divided the other legates
aforesaid — And I do here and bequeath unto my daughter Mary McNabb Margaret
McNabb Jane McNabb and Keturah McNabb five Shillings to be paid to them one year
after my decease by the other legates — And I constitute my son John McNabb and
David McNabb to be the executors of this my last will & testament and do hereby
make and confirm and make valid all other wills and testaments by

Star I give and Bequath to my son Peter Huykendal the
sum of one Shilling^{Star} and the Remaining Part of my Estate
after the Discharge of all my just debts I do Ordain that
it shall be Equally Divided among six of my Children Viz
Mary Huykendal Ruthy Huykendal Rebecca Huykendal
Abey Huykendal Josef Huykendal and Jean Huykendal and
this I do Ordain and constitute my last will and Testament
revoking all others in any ways by me made in writing
whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Affix my seal this
seventeenth day of Feby One Thousand Seven Hundred and
