linion containing one hundred and ten Acres more or less I give and bequeath  
to my Son Benjamin to him and his heirs for ever Item I leave and Bequeath  
all the Remainder of my Estate, with the increase of what Proportion shall be  
raised from my young Negro Woman Equally to be divided amongst my  
five Children or the Survivors of them when my Youngest Shall come of  
Age and that my above mentioned Negro Jack should be joined with the  
rest of my Estate and equally Divided amongst my surviving Children at my  
Wifes Death Item my two guns I leave to be sold for Cash and that to be  
returned to the uses of my Dear Wife Elizabeth Lastly I nominate Constitute  
(and appoint my Trusty and well beloved Friend Elizabeth my Wife my  
Brother James Ingram & Rubin Vaughan and my Son Benjamin to be  
my Executors to this my last will and Testament and I appoint my Father  
John Ingram a Guardian to my Children as a Trustee to see this Well executed  
Henceby Recking and Disannulling all former Wills by me made & declaring  
this only to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and affixed my Seal this eighteenth Day of December 1759
